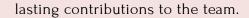

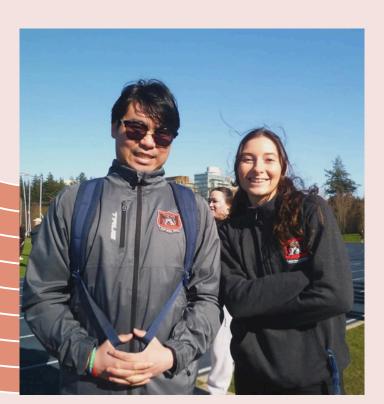

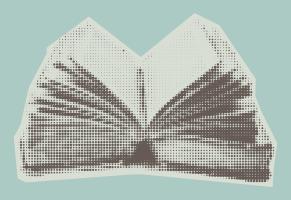
Girls Soccer

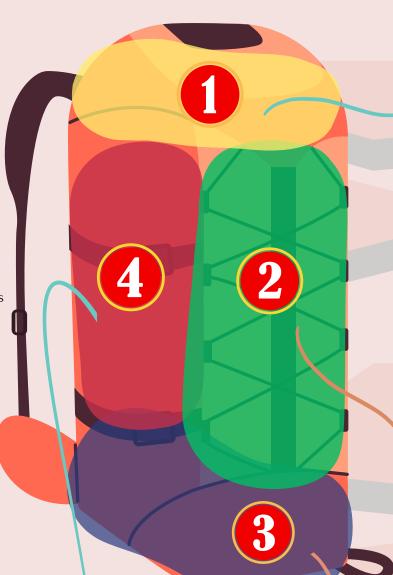

Citrus Earl Grey White Chocolate Chunk

Soft and chewy, sweet and chocolatey, citrusy and floral... these words could be describing none other than this ultimate summer baked treat! These cookies are super chewy like a snickerdoodle, with floral, delicate hints of earl grey tea, fruity notes from the orange zest, and the lingering toasty taste of browned butter. What's better is that you can customize it based on your citrus and sweetness level of choice!

Steps

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F. Line two large baking pans with parchment paper.
- 2. In a saucepan over medium heat, add the butter. Once melted, continue to stir until brown specs form at the bottom and it smells nutty, about 5-6 minutes.
- 3. Remove the brown butter from heat to stir in the earl grey tea leaves. Let steep 5-10 minutes, depending on how strong you want the taste to be.
- 4. In a large mixing bowl, combine the sugar and orange zest. Mix with your fingers to release the orange essences.
- 5. Add the eggs, egg yolks, dark brown sugar, and vanilla. Whisk vigorously for 1 minute.
- 6. Strain the earl grey tea leaves out of the browned butter and pour the browned butter into the egg mixture. Add the orange juice, as well. Whisk vigorously for one more minute.
- 7. In a separate bowl, mix the flour, baking soda, and salt together. Add to the browned butter mixture and fold all ingredients together.
- 8. Fold in the chopped white chocolate chunks.
- 9. Using a large cookie scooper, about ¼ cup batter per cookie, evenly distribute the cookies on the prepared baking pans with 3-4" in between each.
- 10. Roll each cookie dough ball in granulated cane sugar and (optional) the edges in sesame seeds.
- 11. Bake for 10-15 minutes, until centers are set. Halfway into baking, take the pans out to gently bang against the stovetop to interrupt the baking process.
- 12. Let cool on the pan for 10 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack.

Ingredients

2 sticks unsalted butter ¼ cup earl grey tea leaves 2/3 cup granulated cane sugar + more for rolling Zest of 2 oranges 11/3 cup dark brown sugar 2 large eggs 2 egg yolks 2 tsp. vanilla extract Juice of ½ orange 2 ½ cups all purpose flour 1 tsp. baking soda ½ tsp. fine baking salt 2 cups chopped white chocolate (Optional) 1/3 cup sesame seeds

Hey Magee! Do you love matcha? Do you want to hear some light-hearted reviews on drinks? Or do you just want to come along for the ride? If so, you are going to love Magazine Club's Matcha Review! We went to places in Vancouver that sell matcha and would love to tell you our take!

NANA"S GREEN TEA

159 W 4th Ave, Vancouver, British Columbia V5Y 1G4

Nana's Green Tea is a Japanese matcha cafe that specializes in premium matcha goods. Be warned, their high quality comes with a matching price tag. With that being said, let's dive into the matcha.



This drink had a strong matcha punch of flavour from the first sip. It has a frappuccino-adjacent texture and also contains mochi at the bottom of the drink. The drink stayed relatively frozen at the bottom of the cup and we weren't the biggest fan.

BLACK SESAME SHIRATAMA FRAPPE 7.5/10

This bold drink is made up of the same frappucino base with the addition of a black sesame ice cream. It has a high quality taste but lacks the eponymous black sesame flavour unless directly eating the ice cream. This isn't necessarily a bad thing but could be an important factor to note when ordering. The mochi was the same as the ones in the Matcha Shiratama.

MATCHA NAMA CHOCO PARFAIT 9.5/10

This parfait was the perfect balance of sweetness. The ice cream is a delightful touch to the item and adds a milky sweetness that is truly delectable. It presents a great variety of textures and flavours with cereal, red bean paste and incredibly soft matchaflavoured jellies. The flavours meshed well and it was overall a really delicious treat.

MATCHA SWISS ROLL 6/10

This spongy cake was quite simple. It consists of only cake and whipped cream. The whipped cream was soft and light. However, the matcha lacked flavour compared to other items on their menu. It was seriously sweetened but didn't overly harm it as an item.

When drinking this matcha, there is more of a grass taste compared to other matcha. As a result of the ice and general concentration, it has a more muted flavour compared to other similar drinks. However, it was still thoroughly enjoyable.

Questions from gr8s & senior answers | Asia Wong & Hayley Zeng

What will you miss about Magee/High School?

This is practically the last time that I'll be with all of the individuals that I've been surrounded with for the past 5 years. Something that I wish I did during my years of high school is record little vlog segments and take more pictures. You only get to experience high school once and so for keepsakes, you could definitely keep a journal to write in about random events, or again, you could record a little vlog for yourself so you can look back on it in the future. Meeting new people, hanging out with friends during lunch, and learning from great teachers - I'm certainly going to miss it all. Who's the easiest teacher?

Are APs hard?

Of course — they're APs for a reason — but the level of difficulty can definitely vary. Personally, I found AP Psychology to be the easiest, while APUSH was probably the most challenging.

What's STEM like?

Don't leave things until the last minute; you'll need to gather important materials like recommendation letters, high school transcripts, and other documents that can take time to request. After you submit your application, you'll need to submit some mid-year documents and wait for your decisions.

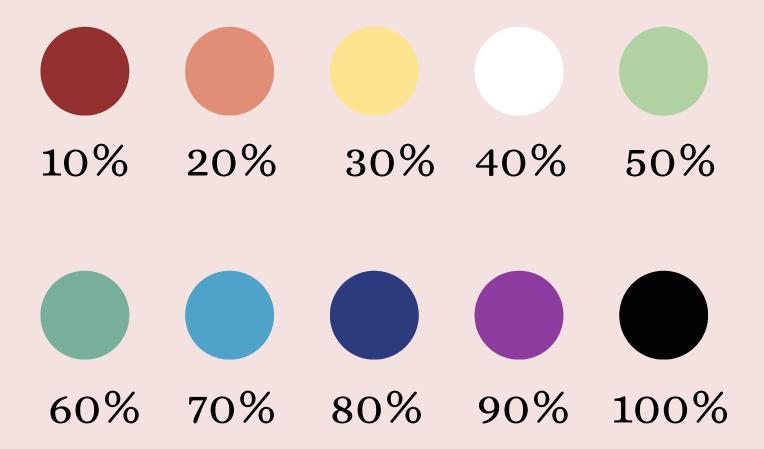
